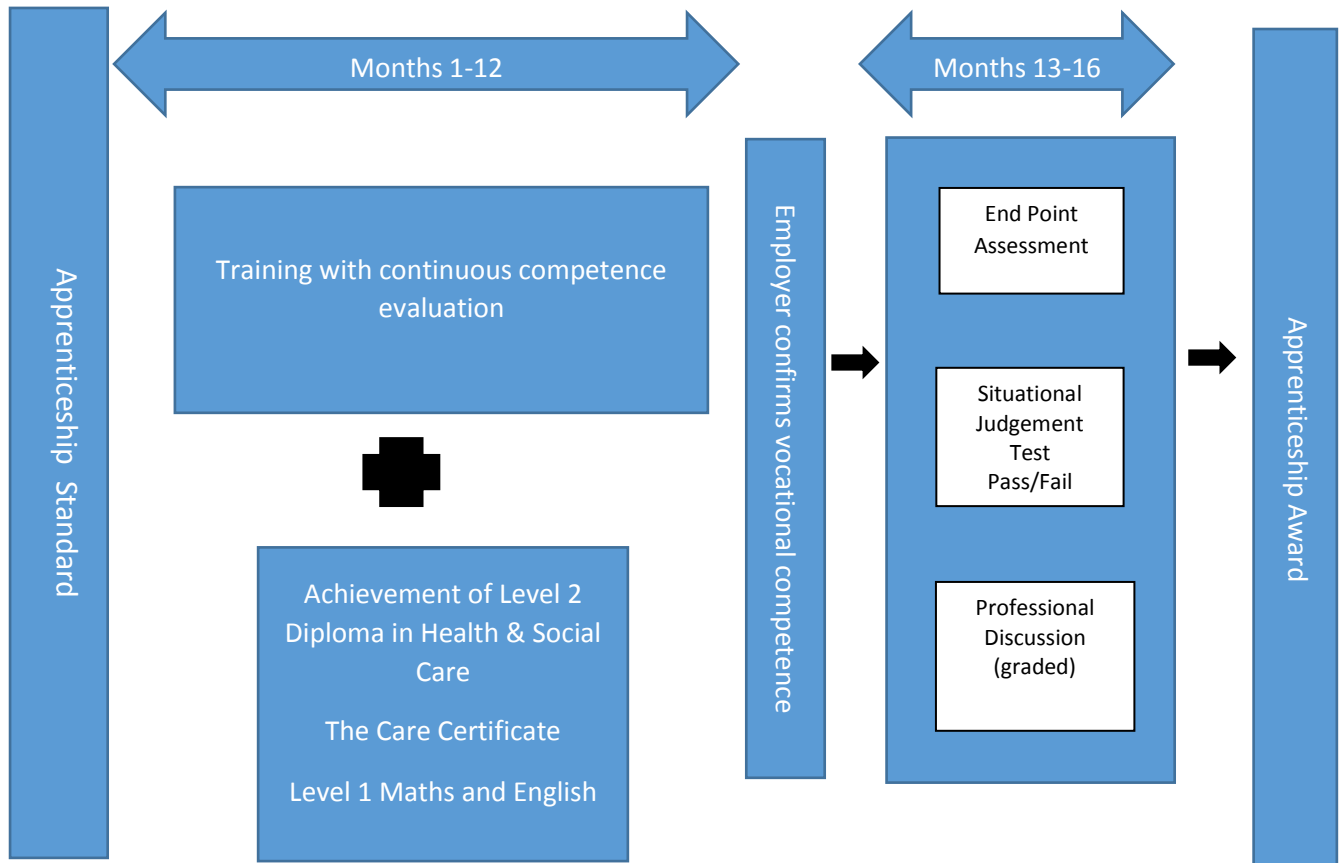


A Summary of Adult Care Worker Apprenticeship



The first stage which is typically months 1-12, will focus on developing the apprentice's core skills, knowledge and behaviours, complying with internal and external regulations and following procedures. This training may take place in the workplace or in a simulated working environment. A review of skills by suitably qualified and experienced personnel from the employer or their nominated training partner that will provide assurance that the apprentice has the understanding of the principles of health and social care practices whilst following systems within a regulated environment.

The apprentices will work towards a qualification recognised by a professional body as suitable for the apprenticeship standard. The achievement of this qualification along with the Care Certificate will be a pre-requisite for participation in the formal end point assessment. Formal End Point Assessment completed in the final 3 months will be based on a Situational Judgement Test and Professional Discussion. The apprenticeship award will be achieved on passing all elements of the formal End Point Assessment.
